



Sign Up For Free Nutrition

In collaboration with the MPS Wellness and Prevention Office, the UW-Extension Nutrition Education Program will provide 640 hours of nutrition education to students at MPS schools between October 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010.

Trained nutrition educators combine the use of audio/visual and hands-on interactive lessons to address the nutritional needs of students as they progress from K-5 through 12th grade. These sessions will be provided on a first-come, first-serve basis. In addition, other arrangements can be made for after-school parent education. In order to secure your preferred hours and dates, **please schedule as soon as possible.** Nutrition educators (English, Spanish, & Hmong) can be scheduled for *five, hour-long sessions* per teacher at your school, based on the availability of our educators. Classroom teachers are expected to contribute an additional 2 hours of nutrition-related work with their students.
